The new site is scheduled for completion in July 2018. Bishop Aranda from Nyamira, expressed his thanks that God will bless the children who will soon call Nyambiri home. Project 24 director, John Kissinger said that it is a big achievement, that this new site is bringing the community and the church together.

Pastor Yacobo told us that she is the first one in church on Sundays. I thank the Lord for blessing her with the help that she needed. This year has been amazing thus far and I look forward to sharing many stories of the work in Eastern and Southern Africa with you.
