## *Back in Asia at last!*

J.P. has hit the ground in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. [Sights](#), [smells](#), tastes and [sounds](#) seem comfortingly Asian, and yet new. The familiar noodle soup uses unfamiliar spices. Traffic patterns (or lack thereof!) are the usual crazy, but with [new vehicle types](#). The sounds of people talking in the Khmer language don't make sense yet. It is humbling to be in an environment in which one is new and inexperienced, but J.P. is delighting in these new sights, smells, tastes and sounds as he explores Cambodia's uniqueness. He spends part of his time on logistics for moving the family later in the summer, including visiting schools and looking for housing.
