One of the great joys of returning to serve as a missionary in the land where my family spent so many years is reconnecting with people who either knew, worked with, or were deeply affected by my parents who served here for 20 years, and my uncle and aunt, the Rev. Dr. Willard and Elinor Burce, who served here for 40. In this newsletter are pictures of a only few of the people with whom we have reconnected in the past year and a little of their stories.

1) Marie having a language lesson with Yako Kosa. Yako worked with my father for many years in the New Guinea Lutheran Mission (NGLM) Supply House at Kumbasakama. We discovered that when I was a little boy we would ride the truck together to meet the DC3 that flew in every Wednesday with supplies.

2) Yacom worked with my mother when we lived at Mukaramanda. At that time her name was Jenny. Since then she was married, but her husband abandoned her for another woman. She returned to Yaibos where she was born and now works at Highland Lutheran International School at Amapyaka where we live.

3) Marty with Sir Peter Ipatas,



Governor of the Enga Province at his father's funeral in April 2017. Sir Peter's father, Ipatas, worked with both my Uncle Bill and my father. Ipatas was the first person in the Enga Province to learn how to drive. He was taught by my Uncle Bill on the first mission vehicle that was purchased with funds raised by my grandmother, Edith Dicke, who at the time was President of the Minnesota District of the LWML. Sir Peter learned how to ride the bicycle on our bike. Several years ago he was knighted by the Queen of England.

4) Kevin was a little boy when we lived at Mukaramanda. My father used to give him a ride every morning to the gardens where he worked. Now he services cell phone towers for Digicel. Here he is servicing the cell phone tower at Highland Lutheran International School at Amapyaka which sits on the basketball court we played on as kids.

5) Kiwa worked with my father for many years. He now is a faithful member of Wabag Lutheran Church.
