

## The Gospel Comes to Seminary Students

I wasn't able to grade my seminary students' final papers from last semester until we returned to the US. While I drove across the Midwest, Irene read me their papers so I could give them a grade. Several students wrote about how the Introduction to Doctrinal Theology course made a great difference in their Christian life and service. One student commented that "before this class I always thought that I had to try hard to produce faith within myself, and that if I didn't actively serve God in the Church there would be no way that I could please God or stand at the final judgment." She said that in reality her faith was almost dried up, because she simply couldn't do all that she thought she had to do, no matter how hard she tried. The seminary course, however, assured her from God's Word that faith is actually God's gift and that God serves us, not the other way around. She is now relieved to know that her salvation doesn't depend on her, but completely on Christ. God Himself creates faith in us through His Word, and now that we are branches transplanted into the Christ-vine, we bear fruit as a *result*, not a *cause* of our salvation. While it's sad to see so many Christians in Taiwan who are uncertain about their salvation like my student, what a blessing it is that through your support we can be here to share God's Gospel with them.




## Teaching Chinese God's Word in the US

While the main purpose we're back in the US this summer is to visit congregations to raise prayer and financial support for our service in Taiwan, I've also had three opportunities to teach God's Word to Chinese here. In two LCMS congregations, Luther Memorial Chapel in Milwaukee, and Our Savior Lutheran in Carbondale, Illinois, I taught my basic "Stream of Life" introduction to Christianity class in Mandarin Chinese. In addition, I led a four-day Chinese-language seminar at Concordia Theological Seminary in Ft. Wayne to a small group of Chinese. I taught especially on Law & Gospel and also on Luther's explanation to the Lord's Prayer in his Small Catechism. We were especially glad that a few attendees now seem to be considering studying at CTS in the future.

## Taiwan Church Leaders Visit the LCMS

July, we were the hosts and guides for two women leaders from our Taiwan partner Church body, as they visited sites in the LCMS and also attended the Chinese seminar at Ft. Wayne mentioned above. Sharon and Rachel were overwhelmed at the abundance of resources that the LCMS is blessed with, as (aside from their stay at CTS-FW) they visited several congregations, one international student ministry location, two host families, three deaconesses, the Concordia Universities in Wisconsin and Chicago, the Concordia Catechetical Academy, part of a Higher Things conference, part of the Consortium for Classical Lutheran Education conference, and Northwestern Publishing House (yes, that's WELS, not LCMS :) ) They especially were grateful to be introduced to so many resources for teaching children God's Word and the Small Catechism. One hope is that the Concordia Catechetical Academy material in particular might be translated into Chinese and used in Lutheran Churches in Taiwan in the future.
