Bible reflection

In 1 Samuel 17, the Philistines terrorize the Israelites, especially Goliath, the giant. David, when visiting his brothers on the battlefield, is not intimidated. Why not? He knows from experience that God is able to protect him from lions and bears. He also recognizes that Goliath is threatening not just the Israelites but the honor of God. When Saul tries to at least help by dressing him in his armor, David realizes this will hurt more than help. He goes to fight Goliath, not just confident in his slingshot, but "in the name of the Lord of Hosts" (v. 45).

Each of us will also face great challenges and will be tempted to back down and give up. Even when we are courageous, we may try to rely on our own devices, which can cause more problems. Yet, we can remember how God has helped us in the past, trust in His great wisdom and power, seek His honor and will, and give Him all the glory for the ways He is able to use us as His own "pebbles."

Pray for us, praising God for His wonderful plans and promises for us, thanking Him for the power with which He works for us and through us, and asking Him to give us confidence not in ourselves but in Him.

When will you be going?

We will be told when to go as soon as sufficient funding is in place and visas are arranged, which we expect soon after the first of the year. We have had a second week of training in St. Louis, focusing on the transition. We will be out of our house, which is being sold, by the end of Oct. and then stay with a relative. Until then we are sorting, tossing, selling, storing and figuring what to ship.

Financial support

All our funding comes through the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, not an office in St. Louis, but people and congregations of the LCMS. We are grateful for many generous people, for yearly & monthly gifts, and also single gifts.
