in St. Louis (the Spanish version of
Lutheran Hour Ministries) visited the
mission in September as well. In fact,
their visit coincided with the shortterm team. Anthony took one of them



to see the work being done in Ponce, and he spent some time meeting with Yaritza (our local director) and the two visitors.

The last week of September, Anthony was privileged to lead Bible study and worship in Ponce while Pastor James Neuendorf took a short vacation.

Anthony has also spent a significant amount of time the last few weeks of September in meetings about the potential purchase of a building in Ponce that would serve both as a place of worship and a center for mercy work (disaster response, classes, etc.). This is a different building than we were originally hoping to purchase at the beginning of the year, and it has been a complicated and difficult process to get where we are. Please pray that we might soon be able to purchase a building and move forward in getting it ready for service.

We traveled to California for Carissa's Memorial service from September 12-17. One leg of the trip was on an 8-seater plan from Mayaguez to San Juan. It was such a blessing to see so many family and friends who came to support us at the funeral, but of course, it was also a difficult time. We are grateful we were able to go. Thank you for your continued prayers for our family.

Hurricane Dorian and Tropical Storm Karen missed us, although Eliana had a day off of school for each threat just in case we were hit. We also felt two earthquakes during the month of September. Both quakes had their epicenters out in the ocean. I was the only one in our family to feel it on September 5, but several people felt the 6.0 quake on September 23 and its aftershocks. Thankfully there was no damage, and everyone was fine. Growing up in the midwest, we had fire drills and snow days at school. Eliana will remember tropical storm/ hurricane days and earthquake drills.

PUERTO RICO FAST FACTS

Earthquakes in Puerto Rico

Since we felt a couple of tremors last month, I decided to look into the history of earthquakes in Puerto Rico. While there are several recorded near Puerto Rico each year, most are 3.0 or less on the Richter Scale with their epicenters out in the ocean around the island. There have been 4 devastating earthquakes in Puerto Rico since being colonized by the Spanish, all of which were between 7.5 and 8.0 on the Richter Scale. They happened in 1670, 1787, 1867, and 1918. Two of these four earthquakes originated on the west coast near where we live, and two of them also caused tsunamis. (https:// www.discoveringpuertorico.com/ puerto-rico-earthquakes/)
