TIMOTHY LUTHERAN SEMINARY CURRICULUM

One of our goals this year is to get more biblical classes into the curriculum. Ron's schedule included classes in Genesis and Revelation.

This year he encouraged the other five teachers to prepare handbooks for each of their classes. Since there are no textbooks, this enables each student to have an outline for the class and space to take notes. It's hard to imagine a school with no textbooks, but this is the norm rather than the exception in PNG.

One of the other missionary churches has a center for printing materials and this has been a blessing for the seminary. We are now able to print books in the country and not have the expense of transporting them to PNG.

STUDENTS FAMILIES

Because of the shortage of garden areas at the seminary, it is not possible for families to come with the students. This year, however, the fourth-year students are bringing their wives to the seminary for the last term.

- that tribal fighting may cease.


