Thanksgiving for medicines, projects in Venezuela and support to refugees through LCMS Human care.

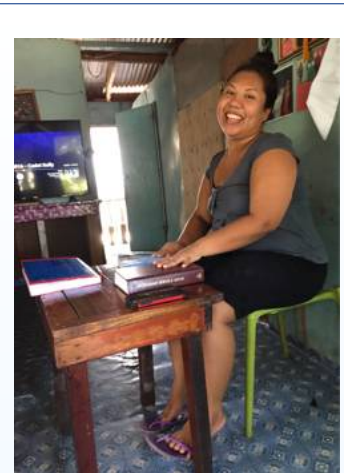
Honduras:

They started a "kid's club" with basic Bible stories, catechism classes, and lessons in English. They loaned the kids Arch books to take home and read during the week and met with them every week end to reinforce their skills. Karina baked goodies for them in their landlord's oven. Now, Benjamin and Karina have moved to the Belmopan area where they are starting a Lutheran sports camp at Valley of Peace. They continue to maintain their relationship with the children in Riversdale, and every trip to the Placencia Peninsula includes a stop off to visit with friends there as well as invite the kids to learn more about Jesus...

Old and new ties with Guatemala

Last week I travelled with Roldan Rios to Guatemala City for many purposes...Roldan graduated from SETECA (Theological Seminary of Central America) and needed his transcripts so he can make application for colloquy as our first Belizean Lutheran Pastor. We visited Castillo Fuerte and Santa Cruz Lutheran churches to encourage them in their outreach. We discussed how best to purchase and equip a mobile medical clinic supported by an LWML grant. (Dr. Ely Orozco of Santa Cruz will be lead on this project). We visited new land that Child Beyond Intl. of Immanuel Lutheran, Hood River, OR purchased to house an orphanage they currently support in San Cristobal, Guatemala, and hugged a bunch of children.
