He came to meet with the individual missionaries or missionary families and offer prayers, encouragement, or anything else he could do for us. He also preached at church on All Saints Day. We were happy to have him here, and we even had an all-team barbecue at our house during his stay.

Following the visit from Dr,. Naumann, a short-term team from St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Esko, Minnesota came for a week. They painted the church, taught English and music classes, and put on a Christian concert at a local housing project where we've been building relationships and hosting outreach events.

It will be officially dedicated in March when the FORO is here in Puerto Rico. Also, the good people of St. Matthew's were so eager to help with the new building that they stopped in Ponce on their way to the airport to help for a few hours before they left.

We celebrated Thanksgiving at church in Mayaguez on Sunday, November 17. We look forward to Advent when we will have midweek Advent devotions in church members' homes this year.

### Juan Ponce de Leon

Many of you may remember studying the famous Spanish explorer, Juan Ponce de Leon in grade school or high school. He is probably most famous in North America for his discovery of Florida and his search for the Fountain of Youth. However, before he discovered Florida, he served as governor of what is now the Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico. He was with Christopher Columbus on his 1493 journey when he landed in Puerto Rico, and in 1509, he became governor of the island.
