Please pray for safe travels for our family who will be traveling to the Dominican to spend Christmas with us. We rejoice to have this time together.

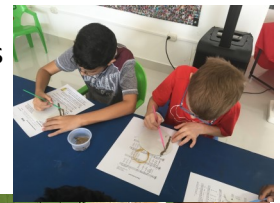
Please pray for the special services and activities happening in the churches. We pray that they strengthen and encourage our new Christians in the faith.
