Language School: Masumbo Camp, Iringa Tanzania

Kenya has over 46 "tribal" groups, many of which have their own language. Nevertheless, they are blessed with a common African language, Kiswahili. (The Ki means language.) Although Walter will be teaching his seminary students in English, it is necessary for him to know enough Kiswahili to communicate effectively.

Language is the bearer of culture. And East African culture is quite different than European and American culture. So language learning also allows us to get insights into the culture of the peoples we will be ministering to each day. We say "peoples" because the students at Matongo come from at least six different countries, not to mention many differing "tribal" groups.

Both Robyn and Walter are sharing a great teacher, Dina, who speaks great English and is a very patient and understanding tutor. We meet with her Monday through Friday from 8:30 am till 1:00 pm (which, we have learned, is 2:30 asubuhi till 7:00 mchana Swahili time!). So far, like newborn babes, we are slowly (polepole), drop by drop, learning the basics of this beautiful language. We are also beginning to pick up some of the unique aspects of this culture, which is far more communal than our own.

The staff at the camp also acts as our after-hours tutors. They are native Tanzanians, are all Christians, and are supportive of our learning.

- That we remain in good health throughout our stay at language school.
- That our Kenya work permits are issued in a timely manner.
- That the Lord continue to raise up more financial partners so that we can serve long-term in East Africa.
- That thanksgiving be given to our Lord for safely bringing us to Kenya and Tanzania.
- That the Lord open up opportunities for us to share the Gospel, even as we study Kiswahili in school.
- That you know the fulness of joy of being part of the Lord's mission in Africa!
