A New Focus

Happy June from the Dominican Republic (DR). I have some exhilarating news for you all. I have officially finished on-field orientation. If we were in non-pandemic times this completion would have meant deploying to Puerto Rico (PR). With the borders of the Dominican Republic still closed, this is not the case. My moto for this time is "I am safe here" instead of focusing on "I am stuck here." This change of phrasing to a positive statement has helped me focus on my time here and see the wonderful things God is doing through this period. Ecclesiastes 3:1 says that, "*There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under the heavens.*" There will be a time when I will be in Puerto Rico but for now I know I am where I am supposed to be.

So, what does the completion of field-orientation mean in these unprecedented times? It means continued Spanish language classes with a slow integration, throughout the month of June, into the Puerto Rico mission work. With the help of technology, I have been able to do much of the work I was appointed to do for the Puerto Rico mission remotely. This includes teaching our virtual English classes, writing the Puerto Rico FORO newsletter, helping the team with our first virtual VBS, and helping order supplies for hurricane preparation.

My work with the English classes includes working alongside missionary Ruth Maita to write the lessons each week and help teach a group of students every Tuesday and Thursday via Zoom. These classes

are based mostly on conversations. We share a short bible story with the students and use themes from the story as vocabulary and discussion questions. The online English class has reached many new contacts and people outside of our church. Praise God for the growth and success of this ministry.

Each month I write our PR FORO newsletter; it has a similar layout to this one. This newsletter is sent to the Puerto Rico FORO partners. A FORO is a partnership circle between congregations, districts and individuals from North America and ministries in Latin America. This newsletter gives me a chance each month to learn and write about all the work and ministry activities happening in Puerto Rico.

A new ministry opportunity I have been involved in this month is the first virtual Vacation Bible School (VBS) the PR team is hosting. The virtual camp will be via the Zoom platform for 3 consecutive Tuesdays, each for one hour. Each Tuesday we will offer children the opportunity to learn about how God created the world. One example on how I have been helping with this is by signing children up through the church's Facebook messages. It has been a great utilization of the Spanish I have been learning! I ask for your prayers as we continue to work together on offering this unique VBS to share about who we are as God's new creation through Jesus' death and resurrection!
