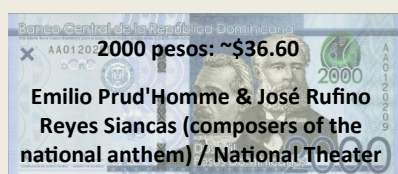
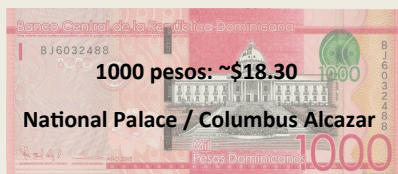

The premise is that as daughters of the King, we are "enough" in Christ and can snub the Enemy's lies that would tell us otherwise. I cannot get a factoid that came up one night out of my head!

As we read through the familiar passage on the armor of God (Ephesians 6:10-18), our leader shared something from Jaynes's book that will forever change how I read verse 16:

"In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one."

She related that in Bible times, shields were made of leather. Imagine how heavy that would have been in battle! But, on top of their hefty construction, shields were dipped in water to guarantee their flame retardant properties as literal flaming darts ricocheted off of them.

Dipped in water.

Whaaaaaaat?!? My mind was blown. Talk about a Baptismal metaphor!

Satan hurls flaming darts of temptation at me daily, but I, too, have been dipped in water. And not just plain water, but living water, infused with God's Word.
