





I know the church is facing challenges all over the world as a result of the coronavirus. I also know that the Holy Spirit reveals opportunities in the midst of challenges. I am excited to tell others about the eternal cure for the virus of sin. Jesus' saving work in His life, death, and resurrection is the cure. He gives us life even in the midst of death.

Thank you for your prayers. The Lord hears them and we are grateful. Thank you for your continued partnership in God's Work in Sri Lanka. Through your financial gifts, we are able to continue to serve the Lord in Sri Lanka.

The kids were able to start their new school term on time. School looks different though. They were able to do their classes online. There were some snags when things first started. Things are running smoothly now.

The curfew has been lifted some. It is now only in place at night and on certain days designated by the government. I can now go to the grocery store. There are changes there though. I have to wear a mask and have my temperature taken as well as use hand sanitizer before they let me in the store. The number of people in the store is limited also. The cashiers wear gloves, face masks, and face shields. They have put up big plexiglass dividers between shoppers and cashiers. There is a small opening where you can hand them your cash.

Just recently we celebrated Skye's 17th birthday. I was thankful that I was able to do some birthday shopping for her so she could have birthday presents. It is hard to believe that it has been 17 years since the day that Steven dropped me off at the hospital and had to run back to church to do the Ascension Day service.
