Cynthia Han is the Director for Children’s Education for the China Evangelical Lutheran Church (CELC). The past few years she has worked with CELC congregations to encourage and direct the teaching of Luther’s Small Catechism to children of members and also neighborhood children. She had formally served for 15 years in a non-Lutheran organization, however, and has been doing all she can to learn more about the clear Law-Gospel Biblical teaching in the Lutheran Church. She was thus thrilled for the recent opportunity to study for over two months at Concordia Theological Seminary, Ft. Wayne, Indiana. Supported by the CELC to make this trip, she was a “class visitor” for three classes on the Lutheran Confessions, and one practical class on teaching the catechism. She had originally hoped to visit Lutheran congregations and schools in Ft. Wayne as well, but, with the pandemic, she was completely confined to the seminary campus and could only attend her classes online. Cynthia expressed that she was inspired by her classes to return to Taiwan to teach God’s Word more purely and faithfully. She said, “so many church members in Taiwan simply believe what their pastor says. But the pastors often don’t really teach the Bible, and the people don’t read their Bibles themselves, so they have

many harmful ideas about their Christian faith.” Cynthia is thankful for the LCMS missionaries in Taiwan, but she hopes many more can come to help teach God’s Word faithfully.

These past five years in Taiwan I have primarily taught Bachelor of Theology students at China Lutheran Seminary. Through the instruction at the seminary, however, he became convinced that Lutheran doctrine was correct, and has now joined the CELC. I had Younging in many of my classes: The Lutheran Confessions, Introduction to Doctrinal Theology, Theology and Practice of Liturgical Worship, and Homiletics I and II. Younging will now serve a full-time internship at Songsan Lutheran Church in Taipei for at least a year before likely continuing further pastoral formation seminary studies.
