A NOTE FROM PASTOR CARL

ON THE ROMAN ROAD: THE PROMISE THAT FEEDS US!

"The children of the promise are counted as offspring" (Romans 9:8b ESV). Paul reminds us all that we who are in Christ are connected to Him through the promise that is God's Word. Just as Abraham, Isaac and Jacob were born of God's promise, so we are born of the same promise to which gave them life. This truth fills our lives with His Spirit and calls us to make known this message throughout all of God's creation.

Here at International Lutheran Church we have been *On the Roman Road*. Last week we came to the watershed moment of this letter as Paul stated that "nothing can separate us from the love of God which is ours in Christ Jesus" (8:39). Today in chapter 9 Paul faces the extremely hard and difficult reality that not all believe. This reality was extremely disturbing and troubling to him personally. He even states that he wished himself cut off and separated from God so that his own people would receive the fulfillment of all of God's promises found in Christ.

There are things that we see and experience in this life that are particularly disturbing - things and pains that shouldn't be. Paul sees the fact of his fellow kinsmen's rejection of the Messiah as saddening. Jesus looked on the crowds of people following Him into the desolate places as undeniably moving and painful (Matthew 14:14). Yet these places and situations are where we sometimes find ourselves - desolate places and empty places. But here in lies the mystery. Nowhere is removed from the promises of God. His Word is the very hope of the world, the very Bread from Heaven that fills our desolation!

Matthew tells us that Jesus went into the desolate place because of the rejection of John the Baptist, who had been beheaded as a party favor (Matthew 14:1-13). He was filled with anguish at the sight of the great crowds and the many sick who followed Him. He fed them all with the bread and fish.

He gave His life for them and us. For us, He entered our most desolate place of all - our own separation with God. He suffered on the tree and was cut off for their sake and ours. Unlike Paul or Moses, who wished their separation would bring the inclusion of their kinsmen, only Jesus, the Promise made flesh, could carry that cross and effect that action on our behalf. Our separation is justified. Only His is truly redeeming and life giving. Like water in the desert or a small lunch blessed to feed the thousands, Jesus is the Promise which feeds us and gives us New Life. He alone is Lord of all. He alone is praised forever more. He alone is the great *Amen*.

The desolate places of our lives, our loved ones, our neighbors and co-workers can only be satisfied and filled in Jesus. While we may join Him in His pain for the lost and lonely in our world, we do so knowing, like Paul, His promise is alive in our lives and our world in the desperate and lonely places we find ourselves. As we join in worship today and gather to hear His Word, either online or through one of our *Socially Responsible Services*, we are encouraged to share this good news wherever He sends us!


SUMMER SERMON SERIES
