

## Trying to Keep the Ghosts Away

This month on the lunar calendar is "ghost month," during which most Taiwanese try to pacify and scare away ghosts and evil spirits from their neighborhoods. A few days ago was the high point of the month, when nearly all homes and businesses set out incense and food sacrifices in front of their buildings for the ghosts. In large apartment complexes like ours, residents bring down boxes or bags of food, and the apartment staff takes care of adding incense sticks to each bag and placing them all on tables in front of the complex. At the end of the day the residents pick their food up again and eat it at home. While many participate in this ritual without much thought, as more of a cultural, society event, we continue to find that lots of Taiwanese are quite superstitious and very concerned about the spirit world and their own fate after death. Please pray for the work of the Church here



that God through His Word and Spirit would bring people from fear and superstition to the assurance and comfort that comes only through Christ's atoning death and resurrection.

## **Brief Updates**

- Please pray for renewed plans to reach out to our neighbors through a men's English (with Bible) class, a women's Bible study, and a children's handbell class. The pandemic has hindered our efforts over the past half year, and we hope to get more organized again soon.
- I recently gave several presentations to the new group of students at China Lutheran Seminary, including on "the central role of God's Word in the Lutheran Church" and also "how to study."
- The China Evangelical Lutheran Church recently began a new effort to strengthen the teaching and practice of the churches and pastors of the seven Lutheran synods in Taiwan. The "Lutheran Forum" plans to hold seminars, classes, informal pastors' gatherings (Winkels), and produce and promote new teaching resources.
