"Is Freddy [my cat] glad to have you back?" I've been asked this often since returning from the US. I'd say yes, but he hasn't actually *told* me as much. Oh, we communicate. His mewling as I linger in bed after my alarm sounds indicates apparent near starvation, his insistent cries as I drain a can of tuna say I had better let him lick it, and a guttural growl is an undeniable stray cat warning. Other times, though, he chatters when I walk in the door or as I'm sitting at the kitchen table, and his message is a mystery to me.

Scripture is full of mysterious things. This side of heaven, our feeble minds can never fully grasp the concepts of Trinity in unity, Christ's simultaneously divine and human natures, God's radical plan of salvation, or exactly how and when Christ's return will come about. And, following a discourse on the marriage relationship, Paul acknowledges the hidden subtext of his exhortations to husbands and wives in Ephesians 5:32:

This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church.

The fact that I don't speak cat (even though it's the same in English and Spanish except for spelling!) doesn't change anything about how I relate to Freddy. I will never stop feeding him or cleaning his litterbox, and you'll find him snuggled next to me night after night. Similarly, the fact that many things about God are unknowable doesn't change His immeasurable love for us. In fact, the very incarnation of His love, His Son Jesus, is "the mystery hidden for ages and generations but now revealed to his saints (Colossians 1:26)." We look forward to the day when we will see and know Him face to face!
