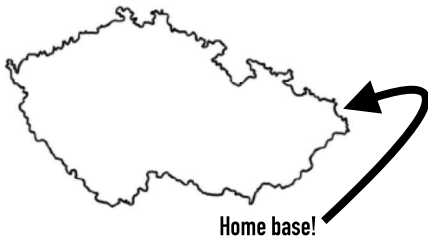

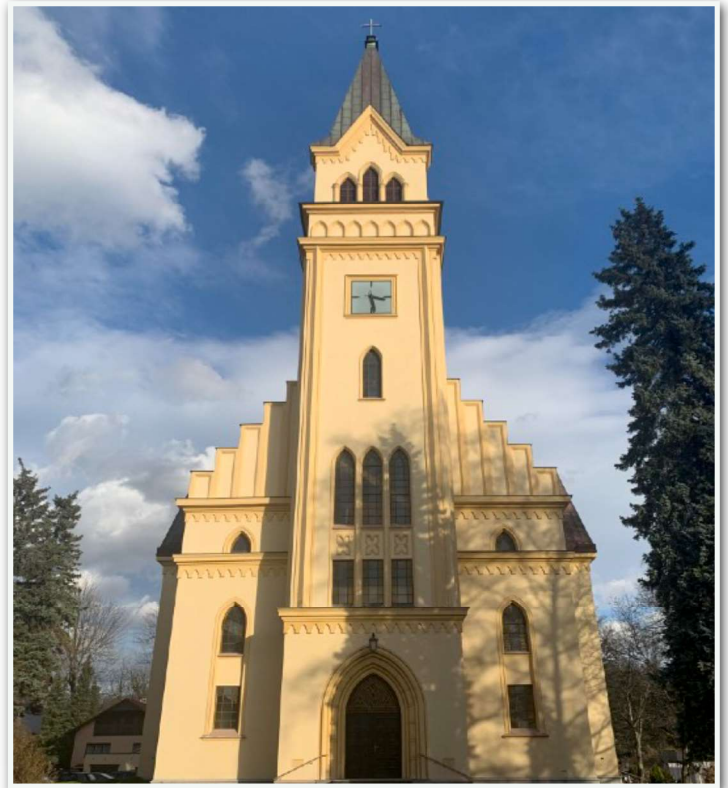
This year for National Lutheran Schools Week I had the privilege of visiting with one special class of students online. This was the kindergarten class from Trinity Lutheran School in Atchison, Kansas where my friend Monica is the teacher. When I was on home service this past fall, I got to be in the classroom with these students for three weeks. While we were in person we talked often about different cultures, and what it is like to live in another country. Kindergarteners are always full of surprises, so when the first child asked me "Chelsea, why don't you have a dryer?!" I had to laugh out loud. They had waited so long to hear the tiny details of missionary life. It was such a joy to see students so engaged in the role of a missionary. Aside from cultural differences we discussed how many people in the Czech Republic are not Christian and that I have the opportunity to share the Gospel with them. Even at the kindergarten level the students understood the importance of sharing the Gospel with others, whether in their own community or abroad.

Monica's comment when I first joined the Zoom call sticks in my memory. "Today we have a special guest. It's *our* missionary Chelsea!" I am so honored to have so many students in Lutheran schools all over the country praying for me, and continuing to learn about LCMS International Mission.

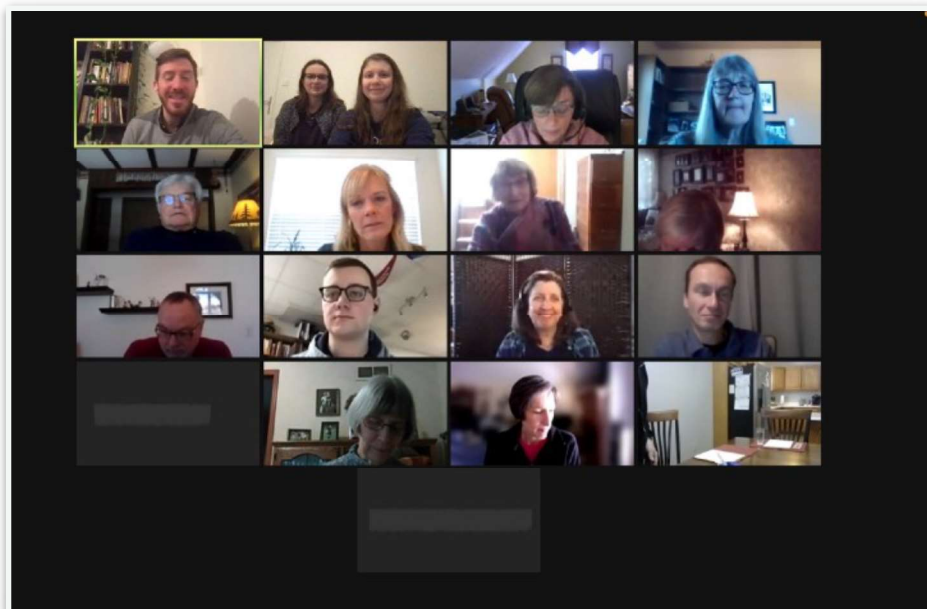
