Visiting faithful, dedicated students during their internship assignments is an enjoyable part of the work on the mission field. Vyson Makwaka is one such man. His course work is finished, and he is ready to be ordained as a pastor in the Confessional Lutheran Church—Malawi Synod (CLCMS). Yes, he passed his internship with flying colors!

Vyson is the first Matongo-trained man in this church body. It has been my privilege to be his instructor and to advise him on this thesis. His studies were made possible by generous contributions from Christians like you.

The CLCMS is a growing church body, which is committed to being faithful to the Word of God. It was a joy, not only to visit Vyson, but also to spend three days with Rev. Davis Wowa, the Executive Chairman of the CLCMS. We discussed the challenges they face and the joys of preaching the pure Gospel of Jesus, so that people hear the message of the forgiveness of sins and eternal life in Christ.

It was a joyful Sunday as we gathered to hear Vyson proclaim the Gospel. Rev. Wowa made sure Vyson conducted the entire service as well so I could evaluate him properly. (I wasn't concerned, But it was a good call!) Pray that God raises up more men like him for the CLCMS.

During my Saturday visit to Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Mzuzu, Malawi, I saw and heard Vyson engage the youth in a deep discussion of the Christian Faith. Using the Small Catechism and the Bible, he asked questions and received answers; he was asked questions, and led them into God's Word for the answers.

Vyson credits the teaching he received at Matongo for his understanding of the Gospel. We know it is the Holy Spirit, who will continue to guide him as he studies.
