This is what was written on my calendar for July 5th, 2022. All the months of preparation, paperwork, zoom meetings, and configuring details were finally coming to life.

This summer was full of firsts! The first time having volunteers on the field after the pandemic, the first time we have ever had LCMS volunteers in the Czech Republic to serve at English Bible Camps, and the first time for me to host volunteers as the official coordinator.

As the volunteers gathered at the Orientation site, excitement was in the air. Following an opening devotion and the first dinner together, we gathered for fellowship in the common room. From the roaring laughter and joyous conversation, it felt like the group had all known each other for years. It was evident that God had selected each volunteer for this specific service long before they arrived.

The rest of the orientation before camp consisted of seminars learning the best tips for teaching English, working with an interpreter, and learning about Czech culture and the local Lutheran church body. On Saturday morning, each Czech host came to pick up their team and drive them to their site of service. Handshakes and hugs went around as the volunteers dispersed. The relationships built at the orientation set the tone for the camaraderie and collaboration within each team as they engaged in Gospel sharing throughout the week.
