New Acquaintance

he most exciting development recently came through new acquaintance with another confessional Lutheran pastor and congregation — Rev. Haga and Megumi (Grace) Lutheran Church in Mito, Ibaraki Prefecture, 3 hours north of us.

After hearing of Rev. Haga's interest in meeting me, I gathered information about his Lutheran Evangelical Christian Church (LECC) background; namely, the fruits of Japan mission efforts started in 1952 by the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) and carried on by 18 WELS missionaries and others over 63 years, resulting in a fully independent, self-governing and self-supported church body recognized as sister church body with WELS and a member of the worldwide Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference (CELC) fellowship.

In its genesis, the LECC has also benefited from Japan missionaries with LCMS connections. It is a small church body boldly addressing current ministry challenges with God-given resources of three national pastors and six congregations in a region particularly known for resistance to foreign influences—even those of Buddhism established in Japan thirteen centuries ago!

The Mito worship service focused squarely on God's Advent Word of promise: "he [the Savior] will crush your [Satan's] head" (Genesis 3:15).

After worship we enjoyed extended conversations with both English speaking members as well as with those more comfortable in Japanese.

The Mito congregation pursues community outreach using English classes with gospel messages taught by WELS Kingdom Workers and Friendship Network church workers as well as by using online streaming of worship services and website content for church resources.

This wonderful new acquaintance came about through previous interactions with Rev. Haga's LECC colleague, Rev. Nakamoto in the Tokyo area, who has also treated me very warmly in our visits.

All these interactions have gone extremely well. We have acquired greater understanding of common resource needs, greater motivation to maintain communication, and greater eagerness to coordinate future planning.
