The GKLI and the Formula

The GKLI was born out of similar conflicts to those faced by the Lutherans who wrote the Formula. Christianity came to North Sumatra through German Missionaries in the mid 19th Century, a time when a genuine Lutheran confession was not prioritized. One-hundred years later in the mid 20th century the church those missionaries organized faced an identity crisis as there were multiple theologies – Reformed and Lutheran - being taught at their seminaries and proclaimed from their pulpits.
