# **Christmas Day**

Christmas day was quiet in the Luther building where I live. We had a festival service at 9 with me playing the hymns and the regional director's children playing the liturgy. I shared Christmas cookies with my neighbors (and the choir members on Sunday). I had a festive lunch with my colleagues and neighbors from Australia, the Lockwoods, and some great conversation. I had a nap. I also had a chance to talk with my family and open the present they sent me, which I had put under the tree (upside down, so I couldn't read the customs label on the top which listed the contents!).





# **Advent Lights**

I did not have an Advent wreath this year. I was unable to find the appropriate candles without traveling to a different city where there is a Christian bookstore. That will be a goal for next year. However, I was very excited that I successfully bought blue Advent lights. There were no blue lights in a box available at the stationery store, so I had to ask in Chinese if I could buy the last strand of blue lights hanging on the wall. I managed to do it in Chinese and was very happy about that! There were many Christmas lights and decorations in the stores, but I only saw one manger scene—in the Catholic hospital near my home.

#### **Cram School**

For the last several months I have been teaching music and English to children at a cram school in Chiayi City. Most children in Taiwan attend a "cram school" after school to learn and study even more. These children are from families who can't afford such a cram school. The leader of the community in which Salvation Lutheran Church is located provides this cram school and partnered with Salvation Lutheran to provide this class. The children learned music concepts and English songs including "Go Tell It on the Mountain," which they sang at the Christmas concert. In addition to learning songs in English, Ruth Wu, the local pastor's wife, taught them "Silent Night" and "Joy to the World" in Chinese. One of my favorite



moments at the concert was hearing the children sing those two songs with energy with the rest of the congregation. After the concert congregation members shared gifts they had chosen with each child and shared in some cookies and hot apple cider. Pictured are the two children I got to share gifts with.











## **Outreach Christmas Concert**

On Sunday, December 24th at 7 p.m. Salvation Lutheran Church held a Christmas concert to reach out to community kids and their families and to share the good news of Jesus, born for all to rescue us from sin. The concert included the church's adult choir, two children's choirs, a choir of women from the Friday Night English Bible study at Salvation, handbells, a string quartet, a piano duet, a recorder/flute duet and a recorder/cello ensemble. Pastor Wu shared Bible passages and the Gospel message between pieces. They also included the text for all the Christmas pieces, even the instrumental ones, in Chinese and English. The adult church choir sang one piece in Chinese and one in English. The cram school children (see above) sang "Go Tell It On the Mountain" in

English with the Friday Night Bible study children singing the verses in English. The concert concluded with cookies, hot apple cider (It was down to 58 degrees Fahrenheit!) and presents for the children. Please join me in praying that the seeds planted can continue to be watered and grow in Jesus!
