A key component of the Project 24 program is letter writing. This is an opportunity for the students to write to their sponsors who live in the United States and for their sponsors to respond. Frequently, the letters touch upon topics such as the ongoing school year, the students' preferred activities, and cherished Bible verses. Sponsors, in turn, share details about their hometown, the climate in America, and often include pictures of their extended family. These small yet meaningful exchanges facilitate a connection between the sponsor and the Kenyan student, allowing them to learn about each other's lives across the globe. As time passes, this connection deepens, and the students express their gratitude for the uplifting words they consistently receive from their sponsors.

## **Beyond 24 Youth Conference**



In early December, a youth conference was organized for all participants in the Beyond 24 program. These are Project 24 graduates who are continuing their education in secondary schools, vocational training institutes, colleges, or universities. Due to the COVID-19 restrictions over the past few years, the youth had been unable to gather in person. This marked the first occasion in three years that they were able to come together.

During the conference, the students had the opportunity to benefit from teachings presented by various pastors affiliated with the E.L.C.K. Topics included Christian mentoring, Lutheran perspectives on salvation,



youth life within the Lutheran church, and essential life skills. Notably, a few university students shared their experiences, offering valuable insights into campus life and serving as mentors to the younger participants.

Personally, it was a joyous moment for me to reconnect with one of the girls who initially joined the Project 24 program as a 5th grader but has now progressed to secondary school. During our time together, she shared how she had grown personally and how she values the program for its support in both her faith and education.
