Presentation at Zion Lutheran Church in Mitchell, SD

We continue to be in a time of raising awareness about the Lord's work in Romania and the Balkan region. Sharing about this work continues to be very exciting as we encounter questions from people and witness the responses of those who rejoice in the Lord's working for the Gospel of Christ Jesus.

At the end of the epistle to the Philippians St. Paul writes,

"To our God and Father be glory forever and ever. Amen. Greet every saint in Christ Jesus. The brothers who are with me greet you. All the saints greet you, especially those of Caesar's household. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit." (Philippians 4:20-23 ESV)

One of the blessings of this work has been the opportunity to do what Christians always long to do which is to greet one another in Christ Jesus- in person! In the early church people knew one another by name and were at least familiar with each other.

In some ways we think this is only the case in a small church body, not one as large as the LCMS. I can tell you otherwise! Even though we are geographically spread out, varying in size and setting, we remain personally connected in Christ in very real ways.

Every stop along the way has been full of delightful connections in the body of Christ! As the early Christians knew one another, so do we! It may take a little conversation and time (not long), but the connections are right at hand. They are personal, but rooted in our confession of Christ and the Gospel.

What Happens Next?

Where will you have the baby?

A lot of time has been spent in the past month making this decision! Do we have the baby in Romania, a town where we have family such as Sioux Falls, or in St. Louis?

Well, we have decided that we will have the baby in St. Louis! There is missionary housing where we can stay. It is on the Concordia Seminary campus so there is plenty of space for kids to roam and play. It is also close to the International Center (our Synod's headquarters) in case Jordon needs to go there to meet with people etc... There are also in-person language learning opportunities so that we can start learning Romanian while waiting for baby to be born. We are very happy to have that decision made so that we can make further plans.

When will you leave South Dakota? When will you leave for Romania?

We will leave South Dakota at the end of May or beginning of June. It is important to us to finish the school year and all that comes with it. The girls will both be confirmed and Benjamin is set

to receive his Lutheran Study Bible from our congregation soon. (He must recite all the books of the Bible in front of the congregation to do so.)

We will leave for Romania about 6 weeks after baby is born or as soon as we can both be cleared by doctors and are able to get the baby's passport! We expect this to be in early October.

What will you do with all your

Each person in our family is getting 2 suitcases. That doesn't sound like much but that is 14-16 suitcases! That's a lot of suitcases!

We did get a very small storage unit which will hold some family heirloom items and a few other things.

The rest of it is being passed on! It is amazing to see how blessed we have been and how much the Lord has provided for us. We know a lot of the places our belongings are going and we are so thankful we can bless others in a similar way as we have been blessed.
