

THANKSGIVING FOR NEW DEACONESSES

Ted and his sister, Tirzah, are concluding their third course that they have co-taught this year to 6 women in the Dominican Republic who are preparing to be deaconesses through our seminary in the Dominican. The courses were on the Divine Service, Old Testament, and Theology of Mercy. The courses have usually been taught on Thursday evenings. The women are now entering their practicum/internship time, working with Deaconess Tirzah and our local pastor, on teaching Sunday school, making visits to the sick, and evangelistic visitation.

Tirzah graduated last year from Concordia Theological Seminary Fort Wayne as a deaconess and also serves as the regional **Human Care Coordinator for LAC** missionaries. Two of the women in the classes are Dominicans who are both members of the mission that Ted and Tirzah attend. Another student, Mayra, is from Mexico. She is in the Dominican while her husband studies to become a pastor. At the same time, Mayra is a psychologist and generously

assists us at our Lutheran school, working with parents and children there, along with our chaplain and deaconess principal. We are thankful that the Lord Jesus continues to raise up those who want to serve their neighbor in their body and give witness of Him with their lives.

Ted has been the deaconess coordinator alongside of the Associate Coordinator, Deaconess Danelle Putnam, over the past number of years. The program currently has around 70 women enrolled from 9 countries, preparing to be deaconesses and serve vocationally. Unlike the United States, these women work voluntarily in their local missions and congregations. Ted was recently in Mexico and heard a report from the Sinodo Luterano Mexico leadership that their Vacation Bible Schools throughout their missions were led by our deaconess graduates with over 1000 children attending across the country. O that more might hear, and even more be prepared to tell of our Lord Jesus for the forgiveness of sins!
